



TIPS AND TRENDS

- If you want multirow seating, remember that ceiling height might dictate the maximum number of rows you can have in the room, since the rows will be elevated on risers.
- Remote-control lighting allows you to modify the mood of the room from your seat.
- A wireless touch panel remote can simplify

your home theater by bringing multiple audiovideo components under your control with a graphic display.

- Indirect cove lights accent a room's architectural
- features and provide effective perimeter lighting.

 Columns are good for more than decoration.
- They can hide speakers, and they can enhance acoustics (hard surfaces diffuse sound).
- Fiber-optic star ceilings are a growing trend in

ambient lighting.

- Adding a stage to a home theater provides a great place for kids to perform karaoke and train for American Idol.
- Consider a rear-projection screen if you have an open basement with other entertainment features, such as a bar, a billiards table, or a bowling alley; otherwise, competing light from those areas might affect picture quality.
